York Technical College acknowledges that it has signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is **\$8,179,231.00**.

For the period of As of September 30, 2021, the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **\$2,351,213.50**.

The total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in the Federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and thus are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **5,339**.

The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **5,339**.

The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act are:

- Based on eligible students enrolled as of March 13, 2021 (spring) and/or July 16, 2021 (summer)), awards were made to students based on their 2020-2021 FAFSA Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and the number of enrolled hours.
 - Eligibility for students who did not submit the FAFSA was determined by their enrollment in a Title IV eligible academic program.
- Award amounts ranged from \$45 to \$500 per student.
- The balance of funds not yet awarded will be used to award any students who may have been unintentionally omitted, provide emergency grants to students enrolled fall 2021, and to award additional amounts to eligible students enrolled in fall 2021 and spring 2022 to assist with program completion.

An email was sent to all recipients informing them of the award and how eligibility was determined. Additionally, instructions were provided on how the funds would be made available to students (see sample email on page 2).
