York Technical College acknowledges that it has signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is **\$8,179,231.00**.

For the period of As of March 31, 2022, the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **\$6,533,336.80**.

The total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in the Federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and thus are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **6,664**.

The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is **6,664**.

The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act are:

- Based on eligible students enrolled as of March 13, 2021 (spring) and/or July 16, 2021 (summer) and/or December 15, 2021 (fall), awards were made to students based on their 2020-2021 FAFSA Expected Family Contribution (EFC) (for spring and summer awards) and 2021-22 FAFSA EFC (for fall awards) and the number of enrolled hours.
  - Eligibility for students who did not submit the FAFSA was determined by their enrollment in a Title IV eligible academic program.
- Award amounts ranged from \$45 to \$3,248 per student.
- The balance of funds not yet awarded will be used to award any students who may have been unintentionally omitted, provide emergency grants to students enrolled spring 2022, and to award additional amounts to eligible students enrolled in spring 2022 to assist with program completion.

An email was sent to all recipients informing them of the award and how eligibility was determined. Additionally, instructions were provided on how the funds would be made available to students (see sample email on page 2).

In response to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal government established the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF), which provided funding to help during the crisis. As part of this fund, York Technical College received funding that is designated specifically for student aid.

The College has established a distribution plan for eligible students to receive money to assist with expenses such as technology, course materials, housing, food, healthcare, or childcare. The allocated amounts are based on your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as noted on your 2021-2022 FAFSA and the number of credit hours you were enrolled in the fall semester.

On Wednesday, December 8, 2021, the award amount will be viewable on your student account via WebAdvisor. Within 5-7 business days, the funds will be delivered to your account through the regular refund process with our partner BankMobile Disbursements. Additionally, the funds will go directly to you and do not reduce or offset any account balance you may have with the College.
